reports of committee chairs

1. Treasurer—reported the establishment of checking and challenges getting that done reported the procedures for accepting donations for the repeal group; reported the procedures for people receiving funds on behalf of the repeal group;

Upcoming Business:

1. Discussed the unfilled positions;
-discussed the positions with regard to when in the time frame each position would be the most critical;
-discussed the critical time frame forwards from this date and backwards from the time needed to get issue on the ballot;
two weeks after filed with clerk for acceptance by clerk (ultimately filed on May 18);
two weeks from that date for clerk to print booklets;

_____ weeks before ballot appearance for clerk to verify signatures = July 24;
2. Critical time frame developed- if action were commenced today and petition were filed tomorrow; the booklets could be ready by June 11 and all the completed signatures would need to be gathered between approximately June 11 and July 24;
3. Based on the time line, the most critical position needed is the intent/referendum language committee;
4. Fred knows of an attorney that may be willing to help, Mike knows of attorneys as well; Wayne knows about the language of government;
5. Considering our critical time frame and the time reservation of the library room coming to an end – the Fred, Mike and Wayne will reconvene at Fred's office at 7:00 PM for attempts to contact the attorney.

Report of the intent/language committee:

1. Meeting at 5:30 on Wednesday, May 16th at Fred's office for a discussion on the issues to be identified in the repeal. Numerous issues were identified thinking they would be needed for the petition to the clerk;
2. Meeting about noon on Friday, May 18th at Hilcorp's offices on Wik Road, numerous signatures were acquired to meet the required number of twelve on the petition to the clerk
3. The petition was filed on Friday May 18th before the clerk's closed for the day.
